

How IBPA handles your personal data

On 25 May 2018 the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into effect. This means increased rights and protection for you as an individual in relation to how your personal data is stored and processed.

IBPA needs to collect your personal data to fulfil its duties and member services. We register and process your personal data only so that we can offer you our services and fulfil our statutory duties. We may also process your personal data in the form of cookies when you visit our website. We protect your integrity by making sure we take all the relevant actions in accordance with the applicable laws.

IBPA will not save your personal data for a longer period than what is necessary to fulfil the purpose for which your personal data was collected. How long that period may be depends on why the personal data was collected but if you become a member of IBPA we will need to save your personal data for as long as you stay a member, and a number of years thereafter, in order for us to fulfil legal requirements.

IBPA may also have to share your personal data with different authorities when required by law. Your personal data may be transferred to countries outside EU/EEA in some cases, but only if we have made sure that sufficient protection measures are in place.

You can always request information concerning what personal data is processed by us, deletion of personal data, limitations on the processing of personal data, data portability or the rectification of personal data.
